## A Message from the Pastor...

Recently, we reached the five-year anniversary of the pandemic. That dubious milestone caused me to think back to those early weeks and especially that Easter of 2020. I went back to read my Easter sermon from that year, and I thought I would share some excerpts with you here.

...we are reminded that life is a precious, sometimes fragile, gift from God given to us for the purpose of glorifying God and loving our neighbor. We are also reminded that there are forces beyond our control in this world, and just because we wish something were so does not make it so.

We can see how we all are so desperate for a cure for this disease, one that works quickly and instantly. Now we should want a cure because that means that the suffering and death that comes with this virus comes to an end. That is unquestionably good, but I think there is also desperation for a cure because we long to make this all go away in the blink of an eye. We want to go back to the way things were, back to our plans, our way of life. Of course, we want that, who wouldn't choose to make this all go away with the flip of a switch, just like waking up from a bad dream? But part of that motivation is also that we can go back to living under the illusion that our life is under our own sole control. We do not want to be confronted with our relative helplessness in the face of disease and death.

This pandemic reminds us every day that Death is our enemy, and that is not a pleasant thought. We naturally do not want to dwell on such things. That ultimate enemy, death, comes for Jesus and as his body is laid in the tomb and the stone rolled over the opening it looks like death has won again. A perfect record.

When death seems victorious, when the future seems hopeless, when it looks like there is no way forward, God makes a way. At that moment of despair and hopelessness God redeems, restores, and resurrects.

When the women arrive at the tomb the earth shakes, lightning strikes, and the battle concludes. The angel delivers the news, Jesus is risen. God has raised him up, death will no longer have hold over him. Death's perfect record is broken. Death's ultimate power is defeated. Death's hold over us is broken.

On this side of the Kingdom, death still wreaks havoc in this world, as we see in our world so clearly right now. But because of the resurrection, death does not have the ultimate power over us. Death does not get the final say for us.

We can see the glimmers and signs of the day when death will no longer have a say in this world. We can see the signs of hope emerging all around us. We see it in those who put their own life and health on the line to serve others; the medical workers, first responders, national guard members, grocery and pharmacy workers. We see it in communities coming together to donate supplies, make masks, and support the work of the hospitals. We can see it in food donations from individuals, families, and businesses to feed those who are hungry and support

those who have lost income or employment because of the virus. These are just some of the signs that death will not have the last word over us. As the days go on there will be others as some of the old ways of life are put to death through this ordeal, new life will rise in its place. Together as we remember that life is God's gift, we have a new chance to put that gift to use to God's praise and glory and for the building up of our communities and God's kingdom.

Because of all this we know that while death seems all powerful, when death is raging, new life and resurrection are not far behind. Death is here but new life is on the way because of Jesus Christ our Lord.

# Kauffman Chicken Barbecue Fundraiser

On Friday, May 9<sup>th</sup>, Christ Lutheran Church and the FUN committee will be holding another Kauffman Chicken Barbecue fundraiser. The proceeds will go to Troy and Sherri Snyder to help them recover from a house fire back in November. Tickets go on sale starting March 23 until May 4. We are asking for baked goods for a bake sale table as well, so if you are able to bake that would be greatly appreciated. For more information, see poster in the newsletter. ### Highlights of January 28, 2025 Council Minutes:

- 1. Additional name is needed to replace Sue Hoffman on Council. Danny Knaub is contemplating it at the moment.
- 2. Copier replacement Dave Fioriglio has been in communication with XPO, a copier company out of Limerick. It will be \$2600 for the machine and \$800/year for the maintenance contract. It would allow 45,000 black and white copies and 8,000 color copies. The maintenance contract offers 24 hour service and if they come out and cannot repair the machine, they can bring over another one while the original one is being repaired. There is no backlog to order a machine at this time. The memorial fund can be used to purchase the copier and the maintenance contract can be from the general fund. Roxanne Fox made a motion to pass and Marvin Steward seconded it. Unanimous vote, motion passed.
- 3. The next Congregational Meeting is February 9, 2025, right after service.
- 4. The Congregational Lay Leadership Information Sheet was handed out to officers on Council. They should be completed and returned to Melissa.
- 5. The Endowment Committee: Norm Hoffman has agreed to take Gerry Flicker's spot. A unanimous vote was taken. Motion passed.

### OLD BUSINESS:

1. AV Technology Update: The new owner met with Dave for a walkthrough to review the setup. He reviewed the specs, site conditions, quotes, and potential challenges. One key issue discussed was the camera mounting. Initially, the proposed location was too low, which would have captured the backs of people's heads. The new owner suggested that if it was mounted on the balcony, there probably would not be any vibrations. The quote will be adjusted to reflect minor changes, however, the overall budget approval remains under \$20,000. The adjustments are minimal, including a less powerful computer since the system will operate via a hardware-based solution. The timeline is as follows: it will take approximately two months to receive the equipment, with installation expected to take about three days.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. Bob Heydt was approached with some minor complaints about the wine. No changes at this time.
- 2. Roberta Korsak mentioned that a member would like to have a photo directory. Council has decided to table this idea for now.
- 3. Handheld microphones should be used at congregational meetings to ensure everyone can hear what is being discussed.
- 4. If there are any events that are occurring, please let the "sign guys" know (Gerry, Pastor).
- 5. If anything financial is approved at council, Sue Hoffman and/or Nancy Fioriglio need to be informed.
- 6. Pastor will be away 2/13 2/15
